Report of the Trustees For the Year Ended 31st December 2017

The Trustees present the report with the financial statements for the year ended 31st December 2017

Structure, Governance and Management.

Governing Document

Horton & Chalbury Village Hall is a registered charity governed by a scheme on 4th August 1977 as an unincorporated charity with administrative amendments passed by a Resolution dated 19th September 2011

<u>Trustees</u>

The Trustees of the Charity shall be:-

- i) the elected members of the Committee of Management; and
- ii) if they so consent, the representative members.

Committee of Management

The Committee when complete shall consist of:-

- (a) up to 6 elected members;
- (b) two representative members, one appointed by each of the Knowlton Parish Council and the Parochial Church Council of Horton and Chalbury (the Councils);
- (c) up to 4 co-opted members provided that the number of co-opted members shall not exceed the number of elected members at any time.

Objectives and Activities

The object of the charity shall be:

- 1. The provision and maintenance of a village hall for the use of the inhabitants of the parishes of Horton and Chalbury and surrounding areas without distinction of political, religious or other opinions, including use for meetings, lectures and classes, and for other forms of recreation and leisure time occupation, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants.
- 2. The land and buildings shall be held upon trust for the purpose of a village hall.

Report of the Trustees (continued) for the Year Ended 31st December 2017

Chairman's Report to AGM 2017/8

This has been another successful year with the hall operations attracting a variety of regular and individual bookings. Our hall continues to be seen as one of the best in the area and we keep our costs low to ensure we remain competitive.

We have continued to build on previous years' work and the volume of bookings for the year to come is looking healthy. During 2017/8 the number of regular hirers has increased, and now include Yoga/Pilates, Art, Flamenco, a local Hospice which organises training days, Breakfast Church, NLP Training, Progressive Movement Practice and Parish Council meetings.

We continue to encourage initiatives which will benefit our local community, and the Management Committee has made the decision to consider offering reduced price hires to such events, especially if they are non-profit making or being organised in aid of a recognised charity. The income from wedding bookings subsidises this.

Fundraising events such as our monthly Cream Teas throughout the summer, Teas with a Talk during the winter, our Annual Quiz Night and our traditional Village Fete continue to be very popular and bring people back time after time to enjoy our facilities.

Our part time administrator, Mrs Zoe Coles, left this month for family reasons and we thank her for her valuable contribution and wish her and her family well for the future. During her time at the hall, Mrs Coles expanded the role with the effect of making the management of the hall bookings more efficient. This also had the benefit of reducing the administrative load on the members of the Management Committee. In the last few days we have appointed Ms Lisa Sheppard as the new Administrator/Caretaker and she starts work on the 1st May 2018.

As reported last year, the hall has operated within budget during the period. The financial management has been very successful, thanks to our Treasurer Mrs M Sadler, and we have been able to add to our reserves (held in a CAF interest-paying account) to ensure financial stability when equipment needs updating or replacing etc.

Previously adopted strategies to ensure that evening hires which include live music or a disco do not unduly disturb our neighbours have proved very successful. We take this issue seriously and shall continue to be vigilant in our management and control processes.
